God's covenant is eternal,


and God's blessing rests upon us all.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

One of the best-known customs for the season is the Advent wreath. The wreath and winter candle-lighting in the midst of growing darkness strengthen some of the Advent images found in the Bible. The unbroken circle of greens is clearly an image of everlasting life, a victory wreath, the crown of Christ, or the wheel of time itself. Christians use the wreath as a sign that Christ reaches into our time to lead us to the light of everlasting life. The four candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent and the growth of light.

Praise to you, O God, who lives with us, sharing our flesh and bones. As Mary waited and Joseph dreamed, so we dream and wait for you. Bless us and let your face shine upon us, more radiant than these candles, and more dear than all else we seek. Restore us when we fail to refuse the evil and choose the good, and banish all our fears. We pray in the name of Emmanuel, your promised child and our Savior. Amen.

SECOND READING ROMANS 16:25–27


A reading from Romans



O Savior, tear open the heavens And down from heaven come Tear from heaven door and jamb, Tear off every lock and bar.


O God, pour a dew from heaven, And in the dew, o Savior, flow down. Break your clouds and rain out The King of Jacob's house.

And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.

Amen.


THE LORD'S PRAYER
