## LENTEN INTRODUCTION

The second covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the one made with Abraham and Sarah: God's promise to make them the ancestors of many, with whom God will remain in everlasting covenant. Paul says this promise comes to all who share Abraham's faith in the God who brings life into being where there was no life. We receive this baptismal promise of resurrection life in faith. Sarah and Abraham receive new names as a sign of the covenant, and we too get new identities in baptism, as we put on Christ.

JOHN LENNON & PAUL MCCARTNEY

We hear a lot these days about a growing "Loneliness Epidemic," and recent studies suggest that for all our technological interconnectedness, we feel an unparalleled sense of isolation. Lennon and McCartney's "Eleanor Rigby" is a potent depiction of two people in the same church, living and working concurrently yet making no connection and remaining lonely. Eleanor and Father MacKenzie both go hollowly about their business, remaining disconnected and isolated, even as they come together in an uncannily intimate way for Eleanor's death and burial. This Lent, we may feel lonely, even in church. How can our gathering in worship and our investment in one another help to ease the "Loneliness Epidemic"? Can we hear hope of connection and community in God's extraordinary promise to Abraham and Sarah?

#### Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>1</sup>When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. <sup>2</sup>And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." <sup>3</sup>Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, <sup>4</sup>"As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. <sup>5</sup>No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. <sup>6</sup>I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. <sup>7</sup>I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you. <sup>15</sup>God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. <sup>16</sup>I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her."




