LENTEN INTRODUCTION

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods. The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.

Today's reading details the face to face conversation God has with Moses and Aaron in which the Ten Commandments are given. Sometimes we wish it could be this clear cut, that God would just appear and tell *us* exactly what to do. This Lenten season some of us may feel "decision fatigue" with all of the small, medium, and large things about which we have to make choices. Langston Hughes eloquently expressed this spiritual situation in a poem titled "Prayer" here set beautifully by Leslie Adams.

Which sin to bear?

Which crown to put

Upon my hair?

I do not know,

Lord God,

I do not know.



READING EXODUS 20:1-17

A reading from Exodus

- ¹Then God spoke all these words:
- ²I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; ³you shall have no other gods before me.
- ⁴You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. ⁵You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, ⁶but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments.
- You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.
- ⁸Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. ⁹Six days you shall labor and do all your work. ¹⁰But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. ¹¹For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it.
- ¹²Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you.
- ¹³You shall not murder.
- ¹⁴You shall not commit adultery.
- ¹⁵You shall not steal.
- ¹⁶You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- ¹⁷You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.






