St. Martin's to Continue Talks on Affordable Housing Project

St. Martin's has agreed to continue negotiating with DMA, a developer of multi-family affordable housing, to develop an apartment building with 50 parking spaces reserved for church use on the SMLC property at the corner of 15th and Rio Grande. The agreement signed on February 27 provides an option period until September 1 for St. Martin's and DMA to negotiate a contract that would lease the church property to DMA for 65 years, after which it would revert back to St. Martin's. Under the ground lease option, \$2.5 million would be paid to St. Martin's at the start of construction, followed by annual payments of 10 percent of gross rental income for the subsequent 65 years. On March 1, DMA applied for a tax credit from the City of Austin for the proposed project.

More information will be provided to the congregation during informational sessions in April, tentatively scheduled for April 7 and 14.
