LENTEN INTRODUCTION

The fourth of the Old Testament promises providing a baptismal lens this Lent is the promise God makes to Moses: those who look on the bronze serpent will live. In today's gospel Jesus says he will be lifted up on the cross like the serpent, so that those who look to him in faith will live. When we receive the sign of the cross in baptism, that cross becomes the sign we can look to in faith for healing, for restored relationship to God, for hope when we are dying.

In today's reading the Israelites complain to Moses that their situation has grown too dire, and they express a desire to give up and return to Egypt. World-weariness is a feeling to which nearly everyone can relate this Lenten season. After years of topsy-turvy life during the pandemic and its aftermath, the fracture of American political thought, and the sheer number of genuine crises in the world, it can be hard to feel anything but overwhelmed and exhausted.

Thomas Dorsey wrote the lyrics to "Precious Lord" after the tragic death of his wife Nettie Harper and their infant son in childbirth. This beloved hymn is said to have been Martin Luther King Jr.'s favorite. It has an incredible ability to hold and express the most intense spiritual pathos and exhaustion while still offering sincere hope.

READING NUMBERS 21:4-9


A reading from Numbers

⁴From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. ⁵The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." ⁶Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. ⁷The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." ⁹So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.
